




It is morning. The king comes.

Now the miller's daughter is queen. And the people love her. One day the queen has a baby. It is a beautiful baby girl. And the queen is very happy.


But the little man comes back.

'What do you want?' she says.


'You know what I want,' he says.

'The baby! Give her to me now.'






'Oh no!' says the queen. 'Please don't take my baby!'

They see something.


'What is it?' says the queen.

'I am the best one at my game! Rumpelstiltskin is my name!'








'Then is your name ... Rumpelstiltskin?'






















